## Reverend Tim Barger

Happy new year to all. As I prepare to start full-time ministry at First Unitarian, I want to bring up the name thing, both my own name and our congregation's. You Toledo Unitarians know me as Reverend Tim, and I hope you'll continue to call me that. It's special because the members of First Unitarian Church of Toledo ordained me, so calling me "Reverend" is directly tied to your action. During my time as religion editor for The Blade, people have recognized "TK," and I've said that it's "TK" in print, "Tim" face to face, but I answer to both. If you're interested in where that TK came from, it's a combination of my initials (Timothy Knox) and a journalist's mark that means information is "to come," or to be added after the story has been written. If a TK appears in print, the assumption is that it's a typo, so there's some silliness on my part in making people wonder if my byline is a typo. It might also be a way to look forward, to read ahead and see what's TK. For my "public" name as the minister at First Unitarian, I'll keep TK, with the "Rev.," and we'll add some bluster by referring to my Ph.D., which is in communications. So the form that you'll see on the church sign and in our Blade ad in the religion section's Directory of Worship and even in the order of service on Sundays is "Rev. Dr. TK Barger," or sometimes "Rev. TK Barger, Ph.D." I hope you'll continue to call me "Reverend Tim" or "Rev. Tim" or even just "Tim." And if your habit is for titles and last names, it's appropriate in this congregation to call me "Reverend Barger" instead of "Dr. Barger" because of your making me a reverend. And, if you prefer "TK," go for it. As I noted, I answer to all of those variations. My Facebook page is "Tim Barger" and you're welcome to friend me if you'd like. It's a personal page, so the content is not all minister and church related. On Twitter, I'm @TK\_Barger and that has been used primarily as a professional page, with links to my published work, and you can follow that if you're into tweets. The official name of our religious society is First Unitarian Church of Toledo. We never formally adapted the "Unitarian Universalist" name after the American Unitarian Association and the Universalist Church of America consolidated in 1961 to become the Unitarian Universalist Association of Congregations. The "First" doesn't have much meaning when we're the only one in Toledo, and the five northwest Ohio congregations all have uniqueness. Three have Unitarian Universalist in their names and there's First Universalist Church of Lyons. I like that we're still referred to as Unitarian, though we're a Unitarian Universalist congregation and we have some members who lean more to the Universalist aspects of our heritage than the Unitarian. I prefer that to the habit of abbreviating to just "UU," as few people outside of our own churches know what "UU" stands for. I've also taken to referring to us sometimes as "Toledo Unitarians," acknowledging that we're the people, not just an institution. So here's the name summary: Rev. Tim is the minister for the Toledo Unitarians. More formally, Rev. Dr. TK Barger is the minister of First Unitarian Church of Toledo. And please, don't let's start on "the" Rev. Every unused "the" ends up at The Ohio State University, and that's a column for someone else. My new church email is revtim@uutoledo.org. Please use it to be in touch.
