We can't come together yet, but we can be with one another as technology and in-person social-distancing guidelines allow. For Indigenous Peoples Day this year, I made time to read An Indigenous Peoples' History of the United States by Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz, which was last year's UU common read. It is a difficult book to read – I'm glad I have also recently read White Fragility, which helps break down resistance to reforming one's understanding of historical narratives as told by the dominant culture. I suppose I had always understood on some level that the United States' march across the continent resulted in significant loss of life by indigenous people, including their children and elders, but this book lays it out very unavoidably. It makes our myth of an original Thanksgiving shared by white settlers (our UU spiritual ancestors the Pilgrims) and Indians much more sinister ... as the settlers go on to steal the food and the land that produces it, once they are shown its bounty. Rather than taming the wilderness, we merely took over the farms and deer parks already established by the original inhabitants. Do those ideas make you uncomfortable? Why do you think that is the case? What can we learn together about how to center the narratives of the BIPOCs in the US, and here among us?
