Rev. Dr. TK Barger Sunday September 5 Labor

It's another holiday weekend outdoor service. As you celebrate Labor Day, come to a Sunday service in which we talk about work—and the labor movement (your senior minister, as well as some of your fellow congregants during at least part of their time at the Blade, were in the Toledo Newspaper Guild of the CWA)—with some spiritual perspective.

Sunday, September 12 **Quintessence (Ingathering)**

It's ingathering time, the traditional beginning of our "church year." At ingathering for the past several years we've been celebrating the elements—fire (2017), air (2018), water (2019), and earth (2020). This year, learn about the mystical fifth element, quintessence. Ingathering has been on our schedule as the Sunday to resume indoor, in-person services. The pandemic, and the percentage of vaccinations in the area, have not progressed as we had hoped, so this will be an outdoor service instead—in-person, but not our return to the sanctuary. Look for more information on what else we'll do on the 12th as the date nears.

Building & Grounds: A Virtual Tour (International Day of Peace) Sunday, September 19 Rev. Dr. TK Barger

While our church has been largely "shut down" during the pandemic, it hasn't sat idle. We'll show some of the attention our building and grounds have gotten since March 2020 and speculate on what we might do next. September 19 is also the United Nations International Day of Peace, and we'll have a peace ritual in the service.

Sunday, September 26 Hiroshima & Hersey Rev. Dr. TK Barger

On September 26, the United Nations International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons, we'll focus on the story of an early report on results of the U.S. dropping a nuclear bomb on Hiroshima, Japan, during World War II. The report is John Hersey's book Hiroshima, and the story includes the unusual way it was published, first in The New Yorker and then as a book. It's still relevant today, 75 years after publication.

There are some changes to let you know about coming this month. The first you probably have seen elsewhere, in this newsletter and through other church communications. We're not going to return indoors yet, as we had originally planned for our September 12 Ingathering service. We will have an outdoor service instead, with some added attractions from meetings to possible auction-purchase opportunities to you bringing your own picnic, so please do come to church at Ingathering time—just not into the

building. We will go back to mostly online Sunday services on our ToledoUnitarians YouTube channel after that, except for another outdoor service October 10 when we'll begin our stewardship campaign. Conditions had looked good for our being "back to" a "new normal." But with the sharp return to a high load of Covid cases, thanks in part to the Delta variant and also helped by a lower-than-desired vaccination rate (please get the vaccine if you haven't yet!), we don't think that general health safety would be good enough, even with most of our congregation vaccinated, to proceed as if we were past the pandemic. Plus we remember that our church folks under age 12 can't yet receive protection beyond masks and social distance, and we hope a vaccine will be approved for them very soon. Other opportunities to take part in church activities are emerging, so do watch our emailed UU-FYI; our Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram feeds, our website, and our Sunday service and its bulletin, for more details. The second change is with my health. My report is that five weeks of radiation every weekday have concluded, so that part of my cancer treatment is finished for this discovery of tumors at the top of my vertebrae. On September 10 I'll begin the primary parts of chemotherapy, taking a capsule called Revlimid (which I also took in 2017 for the tumor that was on my collarbone), injections of a drug called Velcade, and continuing the Dexamethasone pill which I'm already taking. I don't know how long that treatment will take—it could be several months. Know that, as your minister, I can do almost everything I could before this cancer diagnosis, and that includes one-on-one pastoral care visits and other ways to be of direct help and ministry as well as doing our public ministry and other church work. Reach out to me if you'd like, I'm honored to be a resource for you. -Rev. Tim

I am sure many of you must be as frustrated as I am with the course of the pandemic. However, we made it – we did a whole year of church almost entirely online. Do look for our expected rummage sale this month, which can be an outdoor event (weather permitting). We continue to hope that vaccines can be approved for the kids under 12, the delta variant will burn itself out, and vaccination rates can continue to increase so that we can find a new normal back in person again soon.
