Sunday, December 5 Our Invented Holidays

Unitarian Universalists came up with the holidays Chalica and IllUUmination, giving attention to our religion in the crowded holiday season and, perhaps, taking away some of the seasonal spirit that comes with well-established observances. We'll look at invented holidays and why they're begun.

Clara Barton, a Universalist who as a nurse founded the American Red Cross, was born on December 25, 1821, 200 years ago. We'll tell her story.

Our annual family Christmas Eve service celebrates the season while giving some spirituality to remember that there's more than gifts and feasting at holiday time.

Sunday, December 26 Who are UUs: Remembering, Identity, and Community Melissa Jeter

Who are Unitarian Universalists? We bring ourselves to this faith with many different experiences. So, we interpret Unitarian Universalism through a variety of lenses. The symbols we use, the stories we tell, the information we gather from various sources, and the narratives about our faith ancestors as well as theologians convey meanings about our identity and community. In this sermon, seminarian Melissa Jeter will use symbols, stories, as well as narratives about faith ancestors and ideas from current theologians to re-member identity and community in Unitarian Universalism.

December is upon us—the final month of 2021, filled with the holiday season. At First Unitarian, we're hoping to add to the holiday spirit, and there is some tradition for us to revive between now and New Year's Day. On November 28, with "Season's Greetings," we start the celebratory push; on that day this year, both Advent and Hanukkah begin. During December we usually would have a dedicated service for religious education, but our RE program is on temporary hold—and we are figuring out how to relaunch including hiring a new RE director—so instead of children's RE, on December 5 we'll look at "Our Invented Holidays," the UU-originated Chalica and IllUUmination, including some thoughts on why some Unitarian Universalists wanted their own holiday rather than the many that are on the calendar near the end of the year. On December 12 we'll have our wintertime all-music service, led by Mickey Emch, our music director who has had to innovate more than most of us for Covid-time, I'd say—what to do about choir, how to provide weekly music, in what ways congregants can take part in the music program. Then on December 19, the Sunday before Christmas, we'll get to some Universalist history for the 200th birth anniversary of Clara Barton, the nurse who founded the American Red Cross. At that service, it's likely that we can also have child dedications; a congregation child or two had to wait a year for this thanks to the pandemic. We'll have a Christmas Eve service, in-person (we hope) at 5 pm on December 24. Then our student minister, Melissa Jeter, will close the year, leading the service on December 26. Most of us are trying now for "more normal," I'd say—but not "back to normal" as Covid won't just go away. With masks and distance and good vaccination percentage among the Toledo Unitarians, I think your church is a safe place to be among others, and it can help your spirit, too, through both religious practice and human interaction.
