



# The SECULAR HUMANISTS OF WESTERN LAKE ERIE will host The Last Class Film on Tuesday, September 23rd at 7:00 PM.

Join us for a Screening of *The Last Class* at Cinemark Franklin Park 16 and XD. *The Last Class* is a nuanced and deeply personal portrait of master educator Robert Reich teaching his final course and reflecting on a period of immense transformation, personally and globally. It is a love letter to education.

The former Secretary of Labor might be famous for his public service, best-selling books, and viral social media posts, but he always considered teaching his true calling. Now, after over 40 years and an extraordinary 40,000 students, Reich is preparing for his last class. Over the course of the film, Reich confronts the impending finality, and his own aging, with increasing candor, introspection, and, ultimately, emotion. He displays a rawness of feeling he has never shared publicly before. Drawing on his lifetime in politics, he uses his class, "Wealth and Poverty," to offer us all a deeper look at why inequalities of income and wealth have widened significantly since the late 1970s, and why this poses dangerous risks to our society.

Humanists support education based on the truth, facts, and data. We also support social justice issues that Robert Reich talks about, and we are also concerned about income inequalities. We need to sell at least 60 tickets by August 24, 2025 for this event to happen. Even if you can't attend, you can buy a ticket for someone who wants to attend but can't afford it. # HELP MIGRATING BIRDS THRIVE

We are so lucky to live in Lake Erie's Western Basin, where birds flock along the lake to rest and refuel before flying across the lake, earning our area the nickname "Warbler Capital of the World". People come from far and wide to experience what we have right here. Bird diversity and abundance are key indicators of habitat health according to a Nature Conservancy scientist.



We should all do what we can to protect and restore this vital pitstop, providing birds and other wildlife with a needed lifeline. Many birds worldwide face extinction due to habitat loss and climate change. Some of the things we can do to help birds thrive:

- Plant natives to provide food and shelter year-round.
- Stop using pesticides, ensuring there are insects for adult birds and their young.
- Make windows bird-safe. Add screens, strings or decals to help prevent the more than one billion birds that die annually from window collisions.
- Turn off outside lights, perhaps switching to motion activated lights, since many birds migrate at night, using stars for navigation. Turning off outside lights helps keep migrating birds on course.
