





COMMUNITY SOLAR BILLS IN OHIO LEGISLATURE

A small group of your fellow churchgoers met on 8/13 to begin a preliminary investigation of ways to further our solar project at church. We met with Randy Ellingson from Glass City Community Solar. (https://glasscitycommunitysolar.org)

He made us aware of two bills in the legislature that may help us move forward. LEGISLATIVE SESSION BEGINS Sept. 23.

Community energy allows more working families to share in the benefits of local power, without the need to install equipment at home. These projects use neighborhood spaces like rooftops, brownfield sites, parking lots, or open land to generate energy from sources like solar, wind, hydro, natural gas or bioenergy. Customers subscribe directly to local projects and receive a credit on their electric bill, saving money and quickly adding electrons to the grid. 

FIX IT! RE-USE!

Before the tariff wars, home appliances imported from Asian countries were so affordable that when something broke, many consumers would discard the old one and buy new.





imported appliances became so affordable that Americans took the path of least resistance and began replacing broken appliances instead of repairing them. According to an appliance technician, around 85% of appliance repairs involve replacing a part that costs under \$20. What a huge waste of money and resources, not to mention the environmental impact of filling our landfills with otherwise usable appliances.

Now that imported appliances are more expensive, will we start to see a shift back to being a fix-it society? For repairing smaller items, consider our local Toledo Repair Cafe that usually meets monthly at various local libraries. They have an excellent success rate on small repair projects, such as mending, small appliances, jewelry, toys, even bikes - you name it.

The amount of water, energy, and raw materials needed to manufacture new items is vast, and fewer items will end up in the landfill a definite win-win!
