
OWL Facilitator Training

GREEN SANCTUARY



Holiday celebrations are wonderful for bringing people together and making memories. But they also come with a cost, and not just to your bank account.

For example in the weeks between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day in the U.S., studies show that trash accumulates faster (wrapping paper, food waste etc.), and greenhouse gas emissions rise (all that holiday travel!).

Think about what works for you to counteract that trend. For example, drive instead of fly, or offset the emissions from your flight. Instead of paper cards, send e-cards, or call, or visit. Time can be the best gift. Think before you gift. Many people would rather not have more "stuff." Maybe give a donation to a cause or membership to an organization that would resonate with the recipient, or share a special treat such as cookies. Decorate with LED lights. Reuse paper and packaging - use decorative boxes or gift bags that can be used year after year. Reduce food waste - send leftovers home with guests or take them to a local shelter.

No guilt, but with a little thought and imagination you can do your part to make the holidays just a little more sustainable.



Two leading family services organizations in Toledo have now combined in an effort to strengthen housing stability for families in crisis. LFH has announced the acquisition of Family House with the help of \$290,000.00 in funding from the city of Toledo. This makes the resulting organization the "largest nonprofit in the region dedicated exclusively to serving families in crisis.





As you all know, we have been approved for a \$150,000.00 FEMA grant. We had a long delay in moving forward on this grant due to the government shutdown. Although

the Federal government "re-opened" on November 12th for grants, there is now an issue with the FEMA payment portal which prevents the states from accessing funds to provide reimbursement for our grant requests. FEMA says they are working on the problem, so we are in a holding pattern once again. I will update you as I receive more information. Questions/concerns? Contact Sue Childers.
