



## FROM THE MINISTER

Tuesday was the "off-year" election, and the highest office on the ballot in Toledo was mayor. Only one other race had more candidates than slots to fill: for the City Council at-large seats.

When the votes were counted, Wade Kapszukiewicz was reelected as Toledo's mayor, for his third term, which was made possible by an earlier city vote to expand the term limit. And for City Council, special congratulations go to Nick Komives and Mac Driscoll, our council members with close connections to First Unitarian. Both were reelected.

It was a special voting day for my family—you might remember that my wife, Jewel, became a U.S. citizen in April. This was the first election in which she could cast a vote.

Though I might have suggested whom to choose in a contested race—and I was voting on the machine next to hers—I promise I didn't peek to see her ballot screen. Another joy was to see Krista Schneider, our church's board president, at the curb as we were leaving Old Orchard Elementary School after we voted.

Krista was there as a member of the Democratic Party, handing out push cards listing the candidates endorsed by her party. This is one small instance of "UU the Vote" and the importance of the democratic process in living our Unitarian Universalist religion.

It might be a hard time for us U.S. citizens in some aspects these days, but let's keep at it.

- 5. Buy raffle tickets and win an amazing raffle basket. These special themed baskets were created and donated by church members and committees.



## Leave the Leaves

While October was officially Leave the Leaves month, our area's trees are not yet bare, so it is not yet too late to take one of the most ecofriendly actions imaginable.

Instead of sending your leaves to a landfill, leave them where they fall,



or as close to it as you can safely manage. (We do not, after all, want to encourage slippery pathways and broken bones.) Fallen leaves are home to overwintering butterflies, moths, and fireflies. When leaves are bagged and landfilled, all those joys of summer go with them. Raked under trees or into planting beds (leafblowers being hazardous to eggs, larvae, and insects), leaves provide habitat for the aforementioned insects, as well as other creatures like bumblebees and salamanders.

Songbirds like thrashers and robins forage in the leaf layer, providing free entertainment for birdwatchers. Leaving the leaves also benefits plants. When leaves decompose, they provide nutrients and improve soil texture, helping to create the rich loam that so many plants need. Why pay for topsoil when you can improve what you have for free? Leaving the leaves benefits animals, plants, and the household budget.

With proposed federal funding changes, there may be a shortage of resources for food and staples in the Toledo area. A limited supply or budget constraints could certainly affect members of our congregation as well as our surrounding neighbors.

This, then, seems to be a good time to encourage our show of "service" and support. Please continue to bring non perishable, canned goods and personal hygiene items to the church entry way bins.

Remember, this support is meant for UU members as well as any others in need. We already pool our resources with other programs and continue to fill our outside pantry. So, in the spirit of UU caring, bring in what you can and take home what you may need!

#### BE AWARE--TAKE CARE

November's safety topic focuses on food poisoning! According to the CDC, approximately 1 in 6 Americans (about 48 million Americans) get food poisoning. Every Thanksgiving approximately 1 million people in the US get sick from contaminated poultry each year! So...how do we prevent food borne illness?

- Always wash your hands, surfaces, and utensils in hot water and soap for at least 20 seconds and dry thoroughly before and after making food.
- Rinse fruits and vegetables thoroughly
- Keep your frig clean
- Separate foods to stay safe—keep raw meat, poultry, seafood and eggs away from other foods
- Use separate cutting board for raw meat, poultry and seafood to decrease cross contamination
- Raw chicken doesn't need to be washed before use—running it 7nder tap water can spread germs to the sink and counter and other foods
- Cook it right
- Don't leave food at room temperature
- Frig should be 40 degrees F or below
- Freezer should be -18 degrees C or below
- Keep warm/hot food in shallow containers before refrigeration
- Put perishable food in the frig after no more than 2 hours of being out at room temperature
- Do not thaw raw food on counter
- Keep up to date on food recall information
