## FROM THE MINISTER

Near the end of last Sunday's service, Krista Schneider and I took a chance and held an "altar call," inviting people interested in becoming members of First Unitarian to come forward and sign the membership book. I said that, though in the sanctuary we don't have an altar on which to praise the supernatural, we do have a table with chalices and some people do call it an altar.

When I was a child in the Methodist church, near the end of every service the minister would call for those who want to declare their conversion to Christianity and/or join the church to come forward. On rare Sundays, someone would go to the altar.

Before our Sunday service, some people who knew this was going to happen had asked me if we had lined up people to sign. I said that we hadn't; in the tradition of my early upbringing, you might say I was depending on the spirit to move us.

I'm happy to say that we have five new members. At that "altar call," Cathy Miller, Gene Miller, and Tim Reichard signed the book. They had already made pledges, and while I had invited them to membership earlier this year, the opportunity on Sunday got their names in ink.

Just after the service, Naomi Kasturianachi and Jared Cook, new to us but not to Unitarian Universalism, made a pledge and signed the book. We're happy that they didn't need much time after experiencing our Toledo Unitarians ways to be a part of our open circle.

We now have 11 members who signed the book in 2025—you have to go back a dozen years for a higher yearly number of new members. Since I began as your called, settled, full-time minister on February 1, 2017, we've had 64 people sign the membership book; the list of voting members at the May annual meeting numbered 138, so that's almost half the total. Regardless of congregation, it's always the case that some people don't stay long before they seek elsewhere, and there is loss of life for others, but new people continue to be attracted to Unitarian Universalism and to the people and activities of First Unitarian Church of Toledo. They sign the book, they start to be active in helping our church to thrive, and we all work in our ways to make the world a better place while serving our sacred selves, too.



# **GREEN SANCTUARY**



What Will the Day After Tomorrow Look Like?

Last October, 44 oceanographers from 15 countries published an open letter warning of the potential collapse of the Atlantic Meridonial Overturning Circulation, or AMOC. On August 28 of this year, a study published in Environmental Research Letters concludes that a collapse is no longer a low-likelihood event, with the tipping point likely to be reached sometime in the next few decades if global temperatures continue to rise.

For those whose last earth science class was a long time ago, AMOC is the "conveyor belt" of ocean currents that sends warm water from the tropics northward and gives northern Europe and North America a much milder climate and longer growing season than they would otherwise have. So, what does a collapse mean?

A new Ice Age is unlikely; instead, the probable outcome will be greater weather extremes, with much colder winters in northern Europe, the northern US, and Canada, along with hotter summers, more intense storms, and longer droughts. Growing seasons will be shorter. Rain pattern changes are likely in the tropics, with the possible loss of huge areas of rainforest. Species loss will accelerate, and food shortages are likely. Sea levels are predicted to rise eighteen inches or more along the southern Atlantic coast of the US. Oceanographer Stefan Rahmstorf believes that we have not yet passed the tipping point for total AMOC collapse. In his view, reducing carbon emissions enough to hold the earth's temperature increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius, the goal of the Paris climate accords, would minimize the threat to the ocean currents that control so many of the systems we depend on. The day after tomorrow need not be a disaster, but we have to act to create that future.
