

Lake Erie's Toxic Algae:

The Bad News and the Good

The now-annual Lake Erie algae bloom is with us and as of August 24, extends



from Magee Marsh to Stony Point, Michigan, with the highest concentrations of cyanobacteria in Maumee Bay. This year's bloom started earlier than usual, in June rather than July, perhaps a warning sign for future years. Thus far, the concentrations of bacteria have not been high enough to pose serious threats to human health or endanger drinking water supplies, but as the bloom season continues, that situation could change for the worse.

The primary contributors to the increase in problem algae are a warming lake and phosphorus runoff from agricultural fertilizer. Unfortunately, the national government has cut funding for the agencies that monitor the lakes and has essentially canceled all climate change monitoring. (And despite our recent spell of cool weather, the Great Lakes are much warmer than they used to be.) In Ohio, there is no mandate to reduce phosphorus runoff, only voluntary targets that have yet to be met. This year, the legislature cut funding for H2Ohio, the state program for improving water quality, by nearly 40%. Our nation and state are abandoning their responsibility to the lakes that hold some 90% of our country's freshwater supply.

The good news is that at least some localities are addressing the problem even when state and national governments are not. Here in Lucas County, the Metroparks system has for the last several years been involved in stream restoration, marshland protection and restoration, and brownfield mitigation. These efforts include not only such visible gems as the downtown Glass City and Middlegrounds Metroparks or the 1000-acre Howard Marsh, but smaller-scale projects like the recently-completed Prairie Ditch restoration at Secor Metropark, filtering the stream that flows through Toledo's Junction neighborhood into the Maumee and ultimately into Lake Erie.

All of us who depend on clean water need to support our local efforts and pressure our state and national legislators to protect this vital resource.
